# TIRE PRESSURE MONITORING SYSTEM (TPMS)

Monitors the vehicle's tire pressures.

### How It Works





ΓPMS

Each tire valve stem contains a TPMS sensor.



When the tire pressure drops significantly below recommended levels, the low tire pressure indicator comes on.

If the TPMS indicator appears, there may be a problem with the system. See your dealer.

# What to Do

- 1. **Visually inspect** the tires for damage.
- Use a tire air pressure gauge to check which tire(s) have low pressure.



3. Inflate the tire(s), if necessary, to the recommended pressures listed on the label on the driver's doorjamb.








# **VOICE RECOGNITION**

# Key Functions by Voice Command

Control four different systems with the steering wheel buttons and the ceiling microphone.

To reduce the potential for driver distraction, certain manual and touch screen functions may be inoperable or grayed out while the vehicle is moving. Voice commands are always available.





**Pick-Up button:** Answer an incoming call, \_ or go directly to the Phone screen.

Hang-Up/Back button: End a call, decline – an incoming call, or cancel a selection.

**Talk button:** Give navigation, HFL, audio, - or climate control commands.

### **Voice Command Tips**

- **Press and release** the Talk button, wait for a beep, then say a command.
- All available voice commands are highlighted in blue when you press the Talk button.
- For a list of available commands, **press and release** the Talk button and **say** *"Help"* at any time.
- Speak in a clear, natural voice.
- Reduce all background noise.
- Adjust the dashboard and side vents away from the microphone in the ceiling.
- · Close the windows.
- The system also uses a touchscreen display. You can select options or icons by touching them on the screen. This is limited while the vehicle is moving.

To keep your eyes on the road and hands on the wheel, use voice commands for hands-free calling, navigation, and audio. For a full list of commands, **say** "Display Information" and "Voice Info."

# FM Traffic

Provides continuously updated information, including traffic speed, incidents, and construction in major metro areas. Works in cities where a clear FM traffic signal is available.

Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

# SAFETY REMINDER

Your vehicle is equipped with airbags. Airbags do not replace seat belts; they add to the protection offered by seat belts. Airbags can help protect you in some types of collisions, but they do not provide protection in all collisions.

Always make sure you and your passengers wear seat belts, and that young children are properly secured in a child seat or booster in the rear seat. Never place an infant seat in the front passenger's seat as the force of a deploying airbag can seriously injure an infant.
