This Advanced Technology Guide is designed to help you get acquainted with your 2014 Acura TSX Sedan and provide basic instructions on some of its technology and convenience features.

This guide is not intended to be a substitute for the Owner's Manual. For more detailed information on vehicle controls and operation, please refer to the respective sections in the Owner's Manual or Navigation Manual.

As with the Owner's Manual, this guide covers all trim levels of the Acura TSX Sedan. Therefore, you may find descriptions of equipment and features that are not on your particular vehicle.

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# INSTRUMENT PANEL INDICATORS

Briefly appear with each engine start. Red and amber indicators are most critical. Blue and green indicators are used for general information. See your Owner's Manual for more information.






# **Condition Indicators**




# MULTI-INFORMATION DISPLAY (MID)

Consists of several displays that provide you with useful information.

### Accessing the MID





# Tire Pressure Monitoring System

Alerts you when one or more of your tires have significantly low pressure.

#### How It Works

If the tire pressure drops significantly below recommended levels:

- The low tire pressure indicator comes on.
- CHECK TIRE PRESSURE appears on the MID, along with an indicator of the tire(s) with low pressure.





Press either INFO button  $(\blacktriangle/ \lor)$  to scroll to the tire pressure monitor display, then press SEL/RESET to view readings.



### What to Do

- 1. Visually inspect the tires for damage.
- Use a tire air pressure gauge (or check the MID) to check which tire(s) have low pressure.
- Inflate the tire(s), if necessary, to the recommended pressures listed on the label on the driver's doorjamb.




# Customizing Settings Using the MID

Four groups of settings can be programmed using the MID: Meter Setup, Position Setup, Lighting Setup, and Door Setup. See your Owner's Manual for a complete list of programmable settings.

### Modifying the Auto Door Unlock Setting

As the default setting, only the driver's door unlocks when you shift to Park (or turn the ignition off for manual transmission vehicles). Follow the steps below to change the setting. Make sure you are using the key you want to change settings for (Driver 1 or Driver 2).



# DRIVING POSITION MEMORY SYSTEM (DPMS)

Store driver's seat positions into memory for each corresponding remote transmitter (1 or 2).

# Programming the DPMS

- Turn the ignition switch to ON (II). Shift into Park (P) or apply the parking brake for manual transmission vehicles.
- 3. Press SET. You will hear a beep.





2. Adjust the seat to your preferred position.



 Within 5 seconds, press the memory button corresponding to the remote (1 or 2) you are using. You will hear two beeps.



**Note:** Once set, stored positions can be recalled by pressing one of the memory buttons (1 or 2) on the door.

# **REVERSE TILT DOOR MIRROR**

When you shift into Reverse (R), the passenger's outside door mirror tilts down slightly to improve your view as you parallel park. Shifting out of Reverse returns the tilted mirror to its original position.

### How It Works



- To till the passenger's door mirror, move the mirror selector switch to the right (R) position when in Reverse.
- To turn the feature off, move the switch to the middle or left (L) position.



# **REARVIEW CAMERA** (Technology Package)

For added convenience, the area behind your vehicle is displayed to help you navigate while backing up.

### How It Works

- When you shift into Reverse, a real-time image of the area behind your vehicle is shown in the navigation display.
- Yellow parking guidelines also appear to help you judge distance.
- Adjust the screen brightness by turning the Interface Dial.
- The display turns off when you shift out of Reverse.



# FUEL FILL DOOR

Easy-to-use locking fuel door keeps your fuel cap covered.

### **Opening the Fuel Fill Door**

When you unlock the driver's door with the master door lock switch or the remote transmitter, the fuel door unlocks.

To open, push and release the fuel door in the area shown until it pops open.



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### **Closing the Fuel Fill Door**

Push the fuel door until it is flush to the body.




When you lock the driver's door, the fuel door locks.



# HOMELINK®

Program your vehicle to operate up to three remote-controlled devices around your home, such as garage doors, lighting, or home security systems.

### **Training a Button**

# **VOICE RECOGNITION**

To keep your eyes on the road and hands on the wheel, use the Talk button to say voice commands to operate certain vehicle features.

# Functions by Voice Command

Control up to five different systems with the steering wheel buttons and the ceiling microphone.



**Pick-Up button:** Answer an incoming call, — or go directly to the Cellular Phone screen.

**Talk button:** Give HFL, navigation, audio, — climate control, or AcuraLink commands.

**Back button:** Cancel a command and – return to the previous screen.

Hang-Up button: End a call or decline a - call.

### Voice Command Tips

- When using the Talk button, wait for a beep, then say a command. To bypass the system prompts, simply press the Talk button again to say your command.
- To turn off the system prompts: Press INFO, select Setup, select Other, select Basic Settings, and select OFF for Voice Recognition Tutor.
- When the Talk button is pressed, all available voice commands are highlighted in blue.
- Speak in a clear, natural voice, and reduce all background noise.
- Adjust the dashboard and side vents away from the microphone in the ceiling, and close the windows.
- To hear a list of available commands at any time, press and release the Talk button, then say "Help." For a full list of commands by category, say "Display information" followed by "Voice Info," or see your Navigation Manual.

# NAVIGATION (Technology Package)

Real-time navigation system uses GPS and a map database to show your current location and help guide you to a desired destination.

# Entering a Destination Address Using Voice Control

Set a destination using a street address. For other destination options, see your Navigation Manual.

#### Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

- 1. Say "Display menu." Say "Address."
- Say the entire street address number. For example, "1-2-3-4." If necessary, say "OK" to proceed.

 Say "Street," then say the street name on the next screen. Do not include the direction (N, S, E, W) or type (St., Ave., Blvd., etc.).



5. If the street address is in more than one city, a list of city names appears. Say the number next to the city you want.

6. The system displays the "Calculate route to" screen. Say "OK" to set the route.



# Using the "Find Nearest" Command


Find a nearby point of interest, such as a gas station, movie theater, restaurant, etc.

#### Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

1. From the map screen, say "Find nearest ATM."



2. A list of the nearest ATMs in your area is displayed by shortest distance to destination.



3. Say the number next to the destination you want.



4. The system calculates and displays the route.





# AcuraLink Real-Time Traffic™\* (if equipped)

Provides continuously updated information, including traffic speed, incidents, and construction in major metro areas.

#### Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

#### **Displaying Traffic Information**

Say "Display traffic" to view traffic flow and incident icons.

**Note:** Traffic flow and incident icons are only displayed on map scales of 5 miles or less.

### Traffic Rerouting™

When a destination is already set, you can create a detour to avoid traffic incidents or congestion.

1. Say "Display traffic list" to view a list of incidents on your route.



2. Say the number of the incident you want to avoid. When the incident appears, say "Traffic detail."





3. Say "Avoid," and the incident

4. Say "Reroute" to set the new route.

### AcuraLink Real-Time Weather<sup>™\*</sup> (if equipped)

Provides continuously updated weather conditions, warnings, and forecasts in major metro areas.

Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

### Displaying Weather Information

Say "Information," then "Weather information" for the following options:

#### Weather Forecast

Say "Weather forecast" to view a 1-day or 3-day forecast of your current position or city vicinity.



#### Weather Warning List

Say "Warning list sorted by distance" to view a list of all U.S. weather warnings by distance.



Say "Radar map" to view color-

coded rain or snow systems.

# Weather Warning Map

Say "Warning map" to view colorcoded severe weather systems.

# ACURALINK<sup>®</sup> MESSAGES (Technology Package)

Acura periodically sends you messages on vehicle features, recall and safety information, maintenance reminders, and diagnostic information.

# Types of Messages

There are six kinds of messages you can receive.



#### Feature Guide

Daily messages on features for the first 90 days of ownership.

#### **Quick Tips**

Additional or updated vehicle information.

#### Scheduled Dealer Appointments Reschedule or cancel a dealer appointment. See your Owner's Manual for more information.

## Viewing New Messages

 When you receive a new message, an envelope icon appears on the map screen.



2. From the map screen, press ENTER and select New Messages.



To view all messages by category, press INFO and select AcuraLink Messages.

#### **Diagnostic Info** Gives further information when a

warning indicator or MID message appears.

Maintenance Minder Gives information about what service items are due.

#### Recalls/Campaigns

Reminds you about recalls and safety information.

3. Select the message you want to hear.



Some messages allow you to call or locate a dealer for service or more information.



# **BLUETOOTH**<sup>®</sup> **HANDSFREELINK**<sup>®</sup> (Base model)


Place and receive phone calls through your vehicle's audio system. Visit www.acura.com/handsfreelink to check if your phone is compatible.

### **Using HFL**



HFL Talk button: Give HFL commands and answer incoming calls.

HFL Back button: Cancel a command and end or decline a call.



# Pairing Your Phone

Pair your compatible phone only when the vehicle is stopped.

#### Press and release the HFL Talk button before you say a command.

- 1. Enable discovery mode on your compatible phone.
- 2. If no phone has been paired before, the system gives you instructions.


If you are pairing an additional phone, say "Phone setup," then say "Pair."

3. HFL gives you a four-digit code that also appears on the MID.



- 4. Search for HandsFreeLink from your phone, and enter the code when prompted. Connect to HFL.
- 5. HFL asks you to name the phone. For example, say "Mary's phone." The phone is now paired.



# HFL Phonebook

Store up to 50 names and their phone numbers, which can be used as speed dial entries.

#### Press and release the HFL Talk button before you say a command.

Place and receive phone calls through your vehicle's navigation and audio systems. Visit www.acura.com/handsfreelink to check if your phone is compatible.

# Using HFL



Pick-Up button: Answer an incoming call, or go directly to the – Cellular Phone screen.

Talk button: Give HFL commands.

**Back button:** Cancel a command - and return to the previous screen.

Hang-Up button: End or decline a - call.

## Pairing Your Phone

Use this pairing method when no phone has ever been paired to the system. You can pair your compatible phone only when the vehicle is stopped.

#### Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

- Press the Pick-Up button to go to the Cellular Phone screen. A prompt appears asking if you want to add a phone. Say "Yes."

#### Press and release the Talk button before you say a command.

- 1. Press the Pick-Up button to go to the Cellular Phone screen.
- 4. Say "Pair phone."





- If a prompt appears asking if you want to connect to a phone, say "No."
- 2. Say "Phone setup."



3. Say "Setup Bluetooth phone."



- 5. Make sure your phone is in discovery mode. Search for HandsFreeLink from your phone, and select it when it appears.
- 6. When your phone prompts you, enter the 4-digit pass-key from HFL.



7. Follow your phone's prompts and connect to HFL.

# **Receiving a Call**

When you receive an incoming call, you hear a notification and see the following pop-up message:



Press the Pick-Up button to accept the call.



Press the Hang-Up button to end or decline the call.





# iPod® or USB Flash Drive

Play audio files from your compatible iPod or USB flash drive through your vehicle's audio system. See your Owner's Manual for a list of compatible devices.

### **Connecting and Playing Audio**

1. Open the center console, and pull out the USB adapter cable.



# HARD DISC DRIVE (HDD) AUDIO (Technology Package)

Record CDs onto your vehicle's hard disc drive. Songs are automatically recorded once a CD is inserted into the disc slot.

# Playing HDD Audio

1. Press DISC/HDD until HDD appears.



 The first song of the last recorded album or the last song selected plays. Press (IM) (IM) or (+) (-) to change tracks.





# Searching for Music

1. Press AUDIO.



2. Push the interface dial up to select MUSIC SEARCH.



#### 3. Select one of the categories.




4. Select a track and press ENTER to begin playing.



# SONG BY VOICE<sup>TM</sup> (SBV) (Technology Package)

Play songs from your iPod and HDD from most navigation/audio screens by using simple voice commands.



# BLUETOOTH® AUDIO

Play audio files from your compatible phone through your vehicle's audio system. Visit www.acura.com/handsfreelink to check if this feature is compatible with your phone.

## Playing *Bluetooth* Audio

- Make sure your phone is on and paired to Bluetooth<sup>®</sup> HandsFreeLink<sup>®</sup> (see page 21 or 24).
- 2. Press AUX until Bluetooth Audio appears.





4. Press (₩) (₩) or (+) (-) to change



3. From your phone, open the desired audio player or app and begin playing. Sound is redirected to the audio system.

Make sure the volume on your phone is properly adjusted.





#### Notes:

- You may need to enable additional Bluetooth settings on your phone for playback.
- Remote audio controls and the play/pause function may not be supported on all phones.
- Operate your phone only when your vehicle is stopped.

# ACURA OWNERS

# SAFETY REMINDER

Your vehicle is equipped with airbags. Airbags do not replace your seat belts; they add to the protection offered by seat belts. Airbags can help protect you in some types of collisions, but they do not provide protection in all collisions.

Always make sure you and your passengers wear seat belts, and that young children are properly secured in a child seat or booster in the rear seat. Never place an infant seat in the front passenger's seat as the force of a deploying airbag can seriously injure an infant.

# FUEL RECOMMENDATION

Use of unleaded premium gasoline of 91 octane or higher is recommended.\*

- Acura recommends TOP TIER Detergent Gasoline where available.
- Do NOT use gasoline containing more than 10% ethanol.
- Do NOT use gasoline containing methanol.
- Do NOT use gasoline containing MMT.
- See your Owner's Manual for more information.

Some gasoline in North America contains MMT, a manganese-based fuel additive. Prolonged and consistent use of gasoline containing MMT can deteriorate your vehicle's performance, fuel economy, and the emission control system. Always use MMT-free gasoline if available. Failures caused by use of gasoline containing MMT may not be covered under your new vehicle warranty.

TOP TIER Detergent Gasoline (recommended) never contains MMT and has detergent additives to keep your engine clean. For further information on fuel and lubricants for your car and information on gasoline that does not contain MMT, contact your dealer or visit owners.acura.com.

\*For V6 models, 91 octane or higher is required.
